TREASURERS ... DON'T FORGET ABOUT THAT IRS FORM 990!

I'm one of you as I serve in that position in the Damariscotta-Newcastle club. We have now heard from two very reliable sources~ PID Lew & DVDG Roger on the critical importance of filing even if it is only 990-N (clubs earning < \$25K) or 990-EZ (25K-100K). For most clubs it will probably be pretty straight forward. For some of the bigger clubs that have tremendous fundraising it may be a bit more challenging. At the district convention a seminar will be put on. If your club has an accountant, seek their assistance. Do what you have to do but file. If you don't, there are penalties and interest. FMI go to www.irs.gov and search under EO (exempt organizations) or 990. With the newsletter, I have attached a sample form.

Three components make up this number which according to King Lion Ryan Otis from Belfast is critical for membership. A Lion for 5 of his 26 years, the knowledge he was willing to share comes from the experiences of the Shriners across this country. We need to recruit 5% of a club's membership. DUES ARE COMING DUE - for the clubs. In February, CS Lise will be sending out invoices & International already has for the second half of the 2007-2008 dues billing. As an individual member, if you haven't yet paid your dues to your club - NOW IS THE TIME!
